

## **Disposing of Latex Paint**



You can dispose of latex paint in the garbage, if you dry it out it first. Here's how:

- 1. Add equal parts kitty litter or oil dry or sand to latex paint in the can (one-part paint to one-part kitty litter). If you have more than a half a can, you can also pour the paint into a lined cardboard box, then, pour in cat litter.
- 2. Stir the cat litter into the paint until it has an oatmeal-like consistency that will not spill out.
- 3. Allow the paint and cat litter mixture to sit for one hour.
- 4. Throw the dried paint in the can in the garbage with the **lid off**, or bring it to any of our Solid Waste facilities to pay for as trash.

## **Recycling Paint**

Give your old paint a new life in a Habitat home. If you have a gallon of latex paint that is less than 3 years old and more than half full, we suggest donating it to the Union-Anson Habitat for Humanity ReStore, located at 2520 West Roosevelt Blvd (Hwy.74). The store will soon be moving to Dickerson Blvd, in the old Bi-Lo building.

Paint cans must be clean with no rust or damage to the container. They cannot accept oil-based paints or hazardous chemicals at the ReStore facility.



## **Disposing of Oil-Based Paints**

Oil-based paint is considered a hazardous waste material and can be disposed of when Union County holds a Household Hazardous Waste Collection Event.
